

Shopping Experience

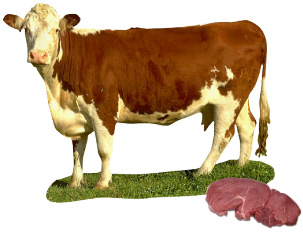
1. Set up a “store” with different sections and either plastic food or pictures of food. Set up check-out lines.
2. Label the items with their prices (page 2-3).
3. Cut up the lists (page 4).
4. Some students will be cashiers and sit at the ends of the check out lines.
5. Other students will be shoppers. Shoppers will take a list, find the item on the list, and purchase the item by taking it to the checkout.
6. Cashiers may need extra price sheets (page 2-3) for reference. Shoppers can pay them (preferably in exact change unless you’ve covered making change).
7. When a shopper runs out of money, they get a job as a cashier and the cashier they replace can shop with the money they made.

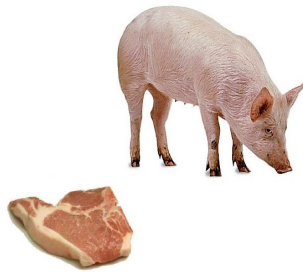
